
Susan is a Lead Artist in the Eco Arts project 'For Our Future'.

Here are some messages from previous Message Exchanges between children, Elders, artists, and educators that reveal our <u>shared love</u> of the Living World.



Over a million short-tailed shearwaters have their rookeries on MIllowl.











The short-tailed shearwaters fly 15,000 kilometres in their annual migration from Bass Strait in the Southern Ocean to the Bering Sea in the Northern Pacific.

If the oceans aren't healthy, the numbers of shearwaters drop and fewer eggs are laid.

Shearwaters remind us how interconnected we all are to our environment.



Children from the We-Wai-Kai Nation, Cape Mudge on Quadra Island responded to Shearwater Messages from Australia.























