










Twelve community stories have been brought together in a Community Art Library Exhibition being held at the Wonthaggi Library. The Exhibition is part of Phillip Island Conservation Society's Eco Arts project 'For Our Future'.








'For Our Future' is a community-based project facilitating a program of Eco Arts events and activities for the Bass Coast community and beyond. The project is designed to inspire environmental stewardship, deepening a sense of connection with each other and the Living World.

The project is being supported financially by the Bass Coast Shire Council and the Phillip Island Conservation Society (PICS).



Members of an interdisciplinary team comprised of artists, musicians, conservationists and First Nation cultural educators are facilitating environmentally focussed activities and learning experiences across Bass Coast.

The key goal of 'For Our Future' is to facilitate environmental stewardship and learning in the community through creative engagement and Eco Arts collaborations which weave together Art, Science and Culture.

The four projects within 'For Our Future' are: Country is Listening, Living Water Ways, Ocean Messages and an Eco Arts Community Celebration at the new Cowes Cultural and Community Centre.

All activities and events are an invitation to listen more deeply and respectfully to the Living World and to recognise ourselves as part of it.


